	 a) Update re: transition to Otipemisiwak District council bylaws and sub districts: There was good feedback, edits made; laws group have reviewed our suggestions and made some formatting changes; bylaws were submitted to the provincial citizens council for review.

	 The provincial citizens council met yesterday; we have not been contacted to indicate any issue; likely will be passed. If approved in principal then we need to call a special resolution meeting (21 days' notice) and have the special resolution meeting to approve the changes No date chosen, we want to advertise and pick a date; need to give 21 days' notice People can put people forward for council nominees from sub districts, map. Gwen-pockets of population, want representation to be connected to population pockets. Brought up the subdistricts map on the tv; there is representation of the members in each of the areas; where you live is where you are eligible to run for a seat on council; once we are interim district, we can revisit the sub districts and also revisit a name change; but as of now it is St. Albert sturgeon. Gwen-need to have a lot of consultation if we change the name Possible special resolution meeting at end of April and pull local meetings at same time/AGM but because bylaws changing, we can merge the meetings.
	 b) Member dialogue with City of SA representatives: Samatha & Trevor We created a local advisory council/subcommittee where a few individuals (or more) would come together where the city of SA could engage with us; to be able to start to meet with the city to consult with us, and engage in relationship with the subcommittee (as our representatives) Projects: National day for truth and reconciliation Metis week Little buffalo exhibit Capital city projects-red willow west; SA NE servicing design project; Millenium Marketing & communications plan with city of SA Trevor will clarify with other city departments to clarify that we represent the Metis in SA; the city will only deal with the sanctioned Metis Local for projects and consultation; some dialogue about this with members of the local RE: Naming: there is a new process by which individuals can submit request for neighborhood name change. City council meetings: is it important to have representation at city council; are agendas sent out ahead of time? City council meetings are always public; they are posted Friday afternoon before hand;

Samantha able to work with local before it gets onto an agenda at city council Northern Alberta Incubator; no indigenous member on the board and no businesses in the incubator; Jim Flett; how come there is no indigenous people being recruited on the board, and why is there no recruitment-Trevor is not sure of city relationship to NABI Trevor will connect with economic development folks re: including Métis voice in economic development. We need a seniors home, in SA; explore the possibility of getting some land in trust from the city; Garry Gagnon; we need housing; Trevor there is some ideas unfolding within the municipal regional table; we can look at it together Once we get our subcommittee up and going we will ask Samantha and Trevor to come back every quarter Environment portfolio-hanging prints-will reach out around that. Millenium-petition to not cut down the trees; project team will come and speak to the advisory council; can come to a meeting or have a separate night to discuss with the community; just need to have a date-Sam Magpie river: has designation as a live entity; Joanne Ladoceur is proposing that the land be protected and given rights; those trees are our relatives-we should not be taking those trees down; Metis millennium park in recognition of the people that lived here; you want to talk truth and reconciliation-you need to recognize the people that exist here No concern for indigenous traditional existence in this area The original Metis families of this city are never talked about, the Francophone families of the community are recognized but not the original Metis families Will be there an opportunity for interlocutors to come in and have input-Gwen There is a petition out; against it-there are amendments required to the municipal development plan; anyone can speak to it at that time-Trevor Need to have the project team to come, and this will be done through the engagement mechanism; the advisory council
