Item 1: Business arising	New business updates
Presenter	<ul> <li>Epcor; Morgan Bamford</li> <li>Morgan: There is a ceremonial feast/pipe ceremony to honor those laid to rest at rossdale station. June 5, begins at noon-pipe ceremony &amp; feast-notice will be sent out to members, shared at meeting as well. Bert Bull from Louis Bull; Maskwacis nations are leading the ceremony</li> <li>Epcor tries to ensure that ceremony is prioritized; monitors have an opportunity to lay tobacco, smudge,</li> <li>Intend to do a ceremony at the beginning of digging season; thanks given to the trees when trees need to be cut down</li> <li>Wood donated to sweat in the city</li> <li>Cultural training could be included for contractors who are on site and don't understand protocols</li> <li>There was prominent Metis families who were part of the rossdale land (nice to acknowledge these families)</li> <li>The water infrastructure needs to updated to better protect the water facilities, multi year project-at both of the sites</li> <li>There is a recognition that there are many Indigenous groups that have significant historical and cultural connection to the land; particularly when there is ground disturbance</li> <li>Hx worked with Metis region 2 &amp; 4, as well as a year or 2 with the local</li> <li>Still figuring out who to work with; prioritize consultation with Indigenous rights holders (FN &amp; OMG)</li> <li>Many projects upcoming</li> <li>Monitoring-do engage with monitors when there is ground disturbance in the river valley; when there is a chance of finding archeological, cultural, historical significance monitors are brought in</li> <li>New to monitoring-archeological finds plan-developed over the last yr, it outlines a procedure when something is found, based on</li> </ul>

Action	feedback, everyone on the site has a role to play (ie. construction workers, epcor, archeologist, monitors, etc). Defines the roles when something is found.  The policy elevates the monitor voice to the same level as the archeologist; they can halt the dig Indigenous monitoring guidelines; outlines the role of the monitor Monitoring-highlighting by membership that our local is the only Metis group sanctioned by OMG; our membership is legitimate and we encourage epcor to work with district 11, there are people who are representative of our community; and people who are not and it is important to be cautious about who working with There is a cancellation fee now; if there is a cancellation within 2 days or less then epcor will pay a fee as well as an administration fee; want to recognize that people take time off work etc. Relational; strong track record working with the MNA Work with the local and the citizens rep which represents district 11/local 1904. OMG is advertising to the communities; June 4-sherwood park; Sandman inn; une 5-doors open at 630-St. Albert inn; June 6-Leduc-coast nisku inn &amp; conference centre</li> <li>Bylaws can be sent out again; and they will be at the sessions as well</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>MNA distribution list, SA distribution list will be used to advertise the engagement sessions</li> <li>Query as to why Fort Sask was not included as it is a large Metis community; Alfred-our citizen's rep, and our local executive suggested these locations; Alfred has not been to any of the local meetings</li> <li>OMG/MNA will hold the elections this fall; they require us to have adopted and have the bylaws in place by July 31, 2024. After the info sessions we will call a special resolution meeting close to the end of June, no dates flagged yet.</li> <li>Funding, based on existing budget the OMG will provide 80G/fiscal year for each district council for its core operations</li> <li>This is in addition to the captain funding; the captain will be elected and have a salary.</li> <li>Bank accounts cannot be established until the district is incorporated; the OMG will be establishing an internal account and make available up to 20G to support us in the transition activities; this is in addition to their support in setting up the meetings</li> <li>There is an opportunity to have legal support as we navigate the path to becoming a district; we have utilized the laws group as well</li> <li>Digital copy-Garry Gagnon would like a copy of the memorandum.</li> </ul>
